

MARION LUTHER BRITTAIN AWARD

The Marion Luther Brittain Award is presented each year to two graduating students (one undergraduate and one graduate) from any academic division of the University who are considered to have performed the most "significant, meritorious, and devoted service to Emory University." Considered the highest honor presented to a student by Emory University, Brittain recognizes two students whose contributions to Emory are outstanding.

The award is made under provisions of a gift by the late Dr. M. L. Brittain, former President of Georgia Institute of Technology and alumnus of Emory.

Call for Nominations

Emory University is soliciting nominations for the M.L Brittain Award, made possible by the generous gift of the late Dr. M.L. Brittain. Dr. Brittain instituted this award to honor Emory University students who have performed significant, meritorious, and devoted service to Emory.

The winners of the Brittain Award, one graduating undergraduate and one graduate student, will each receive \$3,000 at the time of graduation to be used for any purpose of the students' choosing. The Brittain Award will be presented at the 2024 Commencement Ceremony.

Qualifications for Nomination

The Brittain Award is designed to honor one undergraduate and one graduate student from any academic unit of Emory University.

Please consider the following in your nomination letter:

- Nomination letters should address specific contributions the student has made to Emory and the reasons the nominator considers the students' contributions significant, meritorious, and in devotion to Emory University. For example;
 - ✓ In what ways are the nominee's contributions to Emory significant?
 - ✓ Why is this student's contribution to Emory deserving of honor or esteem?
 - ✓ How has this student's contribution expressed their love, loyalty and enthusiasm to/for Emory University?
- Brittain nominees are expected to demonstrate strong academics but note that the focus of this award is on contributions and service to Emory University.
- Please include the nominee's leadership and service activities, honors and other achievements.
- Nominee must be in good academic standing.
- Academic achievement/merit is not a part of the criterion for this award.
- Nominees must be fall 2023 or spring 2024 graduates

Procedures for Nomination

- Nominations must include a nomination letter and the student's resume.
- Nomination letters may be submitted by any faculty or administrative staff of the university.
- Deadline for nominations is Friday, February 16, 2024.
- Nomination (including letter and resume) should be submitted through the <u>online</u> <u>portal</u>
