Emory University is committed to creating a caring campus environment that supports learning, wellbeing, and a sense of belonging and purpose in our students. Doing so is a campus-wide responsibility and we each have a role to play.

Students feeling overwhelmed can benefit enormously from intervention by a caring faculty or staff member. This might include simply listening and relating, a referral to support resources, intervening in a crisis, and/or simply following up to express your care and concern. University officials operating under FERPA and working collaboratively on behalf of a student's wellbeing have tremendous leeway in sharing information to establish an integrated system of care. Informing students up front that you will respect their privacy but also share information to support them creates greater clarity and safety for them.
