Campus Life's NCAA Bracket Competition: Instructions and Rules

Here are the instructions and rules:

1. Complete and submit your bracket.

- Join the “Emory Campus Life” group on ESPN’s Men’s Tournament bracket competition [here](#).
- Create an account (if you don’t already have one on ESPN.)
- If prompted, input the following password for joining the group: emory
- Click "Create a Bracket."

Double your luck! Complete a bracket for the Women’s Tournament by joining the “Emory Campus Life – Women’s Bracket” group [here](#). (If prompted, input the following password to join the group: emory)

2. Filling out your bracket

- Your bracket should predict the outcome of each game leading up to the Final Four and the eventual winner.
- You can use "Quick Bracket" to fill one out in seconds with Autofill, Random, Smart Bracket.

3. Scoring

- Brackets will be scored automatically by ESPN tournament challenge rules.

4. Tiebreaker

- In the event of a tie, the tiebreaker will be decided based on total points scored in the championship game.

5. Prizes for Campus Life Group competition

- May include Emory merchandise, basketball paraphernalia, and most importantly, bragging rights.

6. Fair play

- Please refrain from sharing your bracket picks until after the submission deadline to maintain fairness and integrity.

7. Have fun
